# outdook curling


After 12 years of waiting, the opportunity to curl outdoors, as in days of old, so we are told came our way this year. We have been well warned and cajoled and advised that the sport really reaches new heights outdoors. Jim Murray, Jim Macdonald and Bob Smith met with Aberdour's Alistair Raffan on Thursday 28th December 1995 to drill the ice on Otterson loch. Satisfied that there were more than four inches of ice, they returned to Inverkeithing to gather players and stones and scrapers. By 1 o' clock in the afternoon, helped by around ten curlers two sheets were made ready. The first 'official' challenge between Inverkeithing and Aberdour was played in great spirit and with some considerable skill. Two further challenges were played. Over forty curlers from Inverkeithing, Aberdour and Boreland enjoyed three days of excellent and sociable curling.


Particular highlights were the *whisky*, the roaring and cracking of ice and variet of garbs displayed (some quite spectacular), Ian Macleod's conversation, the *whisky*, Amand Rae's hot sausage rolls, the *whisky*, Maria Tait's last two shots (they reached the head), the *whisky*, and beating Aberdour. But apart from the *whisky*!! the abiding memory was the friendly comradeship. That must have been the feature that moulded the unique quality of the sport over many centuries.

Thanks to all the curlers who attended and helped. very few of us had experienced the sport outdoors. Going back to the origins of the game with different techniques gave us all memories that will last at least another twelve years.
