Safety & Clothing on the Ice:

Advice sent in by MYLOW

- Be very careful how you walk on the ice (NB Robert S). You will find it is very slippery until you get used to it.
- Curling stones must never be carried or lifted except when delivering a stone.
- Never smoke on the ice. (Fallen ash might melt the surface and you will fall through)
- After the end has been completed be very careful when parking the stones.
 make sure no-one is in the way. It is best to use the brush to propel the stone.
- Ice rinks are always cold. make sure you have plenty of blue clothing (corporate colour). If you suffer from cold feet wear an extra pair of socks, or better still, a pair of knee length stockings.
- Curling trousers should be made from a stretch material (waist lines as well as knees) or be loose enough to cause no restriction in the slide delivery.
- Always ensure that footwear is absolutely clean before stepping on the ice.


The rinks have also been affected by injury. Tom Hunter is struggling to play leaving the 'expert'
