100 years of curling in Dunfermline.

We have acquired a copy of this interesting booklet which was produced at the behest of the Carnegie Trust. The guiding light until his death was Jim Murray. His contribution is acknowledged. Robin Park took over to complete the project. Alan Maclachlan and Jim Macdonald were also members of the project group.

The early days of Inverkeithing Club.

Brother curlers will know (if you read the front cover of the programme) that we started of as St. Margaret's Club. It seems this name came as a result of the property so named that belonged to the first patron Elias Cathcart, LLD and advocate. According to Rev. Stephens in a history of Inverkeithing the club was instituted on January 7th 1837. Affiliation to the RCCC followed on November 18th 1840.

Play originally took place on the Ferry Loch, sometimes called St. Margaret's Loch, on the Ferryhills. For at least twenty years from 1845 the pond was situated at Calais in the marshy field on the west side of the moor. Sometimes, and certainly on February 10th 1860, play took place at Inverkeithing, the venue being the area, then a marsh, now occupied by railway lines in the vicinity of the station at King Street.

In 1866 West Bois Acre was secured as a curling pond, and a curling house was built. In 1878 recourse was had to Calais Quarry, northward from Mid - Dhuloch Cottages, where a safety pond was constructed for play. Play probably continued at West Bois as a lease was taken for 19 years and a club house

built. A new sewer pipe from Dunfermline rendered the site unsuitable in 1915.

There are some claims that the club was formed in 1834, but no official records can confirm this. The club did celebrate its' centenary in 1834. It is suggested the club celebrated it's fiftieth birthday by proposing the creation of the West of Fife Curling Province.

The club became known formally as Inverkeithing in 1908. (More history in future editions)
