News from Royal Burgh Curlers 1159

Bob and Liz Smith and Bob and Maria Tait, playing together for the first time, won the main competition Murrayfield inaugural International Curlers Gathering. The event, run over 3 days, was organised by Penicuik Curling Club and attracted teams from Andorra, Latvia, Spain, Slovakia, Canada, England and all over Scotland. At first there were 2 sections each of 14 teams. The results of the first 3 games determined in which of 7 four team sections teams played the next 3 games. There was a prize for each section.

The STs were top of their 14 team section with 3 wins; one against Bratislava who recently completed 8 weeks intensive training in Calgary. The STs were ranked fourth in section 1 behind 3 teams from the other 14 team section. Their next game was against the Latvian National Squad. A tight game until the last end when the Latvian skip was slightly heavy leaving a 5 and a flattering 9-3 win for the STs. morning and it Sunday Corstorphine Ladies on sheet 1. The STs performed poorly, but still a close game on difficult ice. It ended 6-3 against. This meant that all 4 teams had 1 win 1 loss, with ends The STs determining the ranking. Final game was against a strong Penicuik rink. Past results pointed to a close game. But the STs kept their best performance to the last to win 11-1 and crucially take 5 of the 7 ends played. That was enough to win the Murrayfield Cup on ends.

The event was superbly organised and well supported by sponsors. The buffet and ceilidh at the Braids Hotel on the Saturday evening was a memorable occasion. The food was excellent, the dancing non stop and each foreign party played a very full part.

Bob and his rink led by Dave Young had a torrid time at the start of the Seniors – but had a great experience.


(Phi Barton made the 'final' of the English playdowns – the match being decided on the last shot of the extra end)
