Season start

The season starts towards the end of September.

Official news soon. Get your diaries ready so you can book the matches in early.

THE HACK will publish a series of notes to improve your technique and understanding of the rules. Today you can find out more about the signs the Skip gives you - a variety that is for sure.

Skips' Calls and curling terms

In turn - indicted by the skip holding out his right hand

Out turn - Indicated by the skip holding out his left hand.

Draw - Skip gives the ice a tap with his brush where he wants the stone to come to rest.

Take out - The skip taps the top of the stone he wants removed with the brush.

Guard - Skip holds the brush shoulder high and parallel to the ice.

Freeze - A played stone coming to rest touching another stone.

Promote - A stone played hitting another to move it forward to the desired spot.

Raise - the same as promote

In wick - To strike the inside of another stone and roll the striking stone in towards the centre.

Out wick - To strike the outside of another stone and roll the struck stone in towards the centre.

Tee - high - The skip holds the brush perpendicular with the right hand across the top forming a 'tee'

Clothing

Ice rinks are always cold. Make sure you have plenty of warm clothes. It is always wise to have an extra sweater. It is important to have a good fitting comfortable curling shoes. If you suffer from clod feet wear an extra pair of socks, or better still, wear a pair of knee length stockings to keep your legs warm!

Curling trousers must be made from a stretch material or be loose enough to cause no restriction in the slide delivery. Always make sure your footwear is absolutely clean before stepping on the ice - use the mats provided.

Curling Etiquette

Always arrive on time and be prepared to start curling when the ice is ready. Be ready to deliver you stone when your turn comes. Never cross in front of another player when he is in the hack and about to play.
